UK BCR SUMMARY

BDO has approved binding corporate rules for Processors (the "EU BCR-P"), which are an internationally recognized standard providing adequate protection of personal data in multinational companies. The EU BCR-P were reviewed and approved by data protection authorities across Europe. A copy of BDO's EU BCR-P is available at https://www.bdo.global/en-gb/bcrs.

BDO has entered into the UK BCR Addendum to the approved EU BCR-P. The UK BCR Addendum is a formal legal mechanism which extends the scope of the EU BCR-P to include transfers of personal data from the UK. Together, the EU BCR-P and the UK BCR Addendum form BDO's UK BCR ("UK BCR-P"). The purpose of this UK BCR summary is to provide information to: (i) individuals whose personal data is transferred under the UK BCR-P so that they know how their information is processed, what rights they have under the UK BCR-P and how to enforce them, and (ii) Third Party Exporters.

	 The following categories of UK Personal Data are processed by the BDO Network for the following purposes:
	 In relation to Clients for which a Member Firm is acting, the following personal data is processed to provide data input and analytics services, deliver services as part of a client engagement, provide marketing, and for management and administration purposes: family names; given names;

titles; e-mail address; physical address; phone number; images; CCTV recordings; advice, opinions, views and other comments; details of business activities; details of complaints, proceedings and incidents; details of assets, debts, income; bank records, bank statements, securities accounts, insurance policies and remuneration (including salary, benefits in kind, share options, pensions and incentive schemes); date of birth, identity documents, national insurance/social security numbers, tax reference numbers; memberships; monitored and recorded information; and any other categories of personal data made aware in the context of providing Client services for the stated purposes.

- In relation to suppliers, sub-contractors and other third parties doing business with or interacting with BDO, including client counterparties and advisers, the following personal data is processed to provide data input and analytics services and for management and administration purposes: name; contact information; details of services provided; identifier information; CCTV recordings; access control information; images; background check information; security vetting information.
- Transfers of personal data that are subject to UK data protection law may take place from each of the UK-based BDO Member Firms to any of the Member Firms within the BDO network. Each UK-based BDO Member Firm is responsible for any data transfer it makes to a BDO Member Firm outside the UK.
- The UK-based BDO Member Firms conduct transfers of the following categories of UK Personal Data:
 - BDO LLP: Clients contracting with BDO LLP for professional services provided by BDO in the UK (excluding Northern Ireland), and suppliers, sub-contractors and other third parties providing goods and services for BDO LLP equity partners.
 - o BDO Northern Ireland: Clients contracting with BDO Northern Ireland for professional services provided in Northern Ireland.
 - BDO Services Ltd: Suppliers, sub-contractors and other third parties contracting with BDO Services Limited.

 you have a business relationship and all BDO Member Firms are equipped to
 address queries from individuals. You can use the contact details provided in

The rights of individuals whose personal data is transferred under BDO's BCR (including the UK BCR) are as described in the following sections of the EU BCR-P:

- Rule 5 and Appendix 1 "Individual Rights Procedures for Processors" Rights of Access, Rectification, Completion, Erasure, Restriction, Objection and Data **Portability**
- Section C Third Party Beneficiary Rights

As set out in Section 2 "2.3 BDO Member Firms Acting as a Processor" of the EU BCR-P, if a BDO Member Firm acting as a processor fails to comply with the data protection obligations imposed on it by a controller, that controller may be in breach of UK data protection law and in turn the BDO Member Firm acting as processor may face a claim for breach of contract, which may result in the payment of damages or other judicial remedies. In addition, a controller that has entered into a Data Processing Agreement with a BDO Member Firm that incorporates the BCR-P may enforce the BCR-P against any Member Firm processing personal data on behalf of that controller in respect of a breach of the BCR-P caused by that Member Firm in the UK courts, where permitted by law and subject to the terms of the Data Processing Agreement.

How to complain to BDO Member Firms

Details of how to complain to BDO about the BCR (including the UK BCR) are as set out in "Rule 10 - Complaint handling" and "Appendix 3 - Complaint Handling Procedure" of the EU BCR-P.

Specifically where a complaint arises under this UK BCR Addendum in respect of the processing of UK Personal Data where a Member Firm is the processor in respect of that information, the Member Firm will communicate the details of the complaint to the controller promptly and will act in accordance with the terms of any Data Processing Agreement between the controller and the Member Firm.
